From the treasurer

How'd I get here? (on a GL1800 in the GWRRA) - Final installment

I left off last month having purchased Black Beauty from Bill and I rode that for about a year until one day, Bill contacted me about a GL1500 that was for sale. Jim Jeffries had decided to let go of his Barbados Blue 1992 GL1500. So I went over to take a look. The bike was in great shape and the price was very good so it was an easy decision to make the leap forward another 15 years. So in November 2013 I made the upgrade to a 1500. Having had a GL1200 for several years, I had learned that the parts were getting harder and harder to come by, so although Black Beauty was a beauty, I was glad to move up to a 1500 and have much easier access to replacement parts. The additional power was also noticeable and although it was a bigger bike, it wasn't any more difficult to handle. It was also more comfortable for Ann.

In 2017, I turned 60. I was still riding the 1500 and had only been on a GL1800 once. That was back in 2012 or 2013 when we were still riding the 87 Black Beauty GL1200 and we were on a ride with the group up around Mt Rainier. At some point on that ride, the bike developed a bad steering problem — I could no longer hold the front wheel straight forward, only a bit to the right or left. Apparently the steering bearing had developed a bump or groove that prevented me from going straight ahead. If you've never experienced that, it was not at all fun and extremely tiring. I had to constantly be steering just to go straight and my arms eventually became extremely tired. It was not a good situation coming down off of Mt Rainier. So Bill followed us on the ride home. Once we got to 167, Bill pulled over and switched bikes with me so that he could see what was going on. So we got on his 1800 and with the first twist of the wrist I thought I was on a jet! I hadn't forgotten that feeling and now that I was 60, I decided I wanted to move up to an 1800 before I got any older. Finances had improved enough that Ann was ok with it (I won't say thrilled, but at least ok).

So I started looking and ended up purchasing the bike I own now, a 2002 GL1800. So far it has been a pretty good bike. Because of a coolant leak that cropped up and also just some occasional coolant aroma, I have had the gas tank out and just recently took the fairing off (didn't find any leaks but I earned my GL1800 Fairing Removal and Re-install Badge). No

other issues so far and hopefully it will take us on a longer overnight trip this year, but we'll see what happens with the lovely virus situation.

Along the way to the GL1800 I have learned plenty from the guys in the chapter about Gold Wing maintenance. I won't say I could fix anything by any means, but with a little help from my friends — actually a LOT of help from my friends — none of my Wings has ever been to a service shop while I have owned them. I think one of their favorite episodes of helping me was when we met at Don's garage and the plan was to install a trailer hitch that Todd was gifting me — only to remove the rear splash guard and find that there already was a hitch on the bike! They still mention that from time to time.

Social Distancing, what is it?

- Recommended use of gloves Ride Motorcycles



On Wednesday the 8th, I awakened by bright sunlight shinning in my window. I knew it was an omen that I just had to go for a ride. Mt Rainier was calling. Except, the park was closed. On the way back home I had to stop and get a picture of that beautiful mountain, and my new Wing too.



On Thursday I awoke to a story on the TV that said a car had slammed into one of our favorite diners in Tenino, Scotty B's. I had to go out and take a look for myself. Minor damage at best.



Since I had visited one of the local landmarks, I figured it was fitting to attempt to see another. On Sunday the 12th, Easter Sunday, I rode up towards Johnston Ridge Observatory to see if Mt St Helens was behaving.



Turns out, the road to the observatory was closed. That was no surprise and I already suspected as much. I didn't really want to walk up to the observatory anyway. I just wanted to ride. The mountain was beautiful and docile.


