

On December 7th, Cindy went in for her knee replacement surgery. As many of you know, she has been suffering from a bad right knee for some time. Unable to ride her Spyder due to the main and only brake is on the right foot. She could not even ride with me in comfort due to the difficulty in getting on and off the bike. She had to wait for a long time to get a surgery date. When the date came, she was feeling good and the day went well. She came through the surgery just fine and started her recovery. There is lots of pain meds and physical therapy. I could not assist her with all her needs during this time so Patty Alfonso, our Neighbor and Manuel's Sister is providing her 24-7 care as she get's through all the healing and recovery. I have to stay in another bedroom due to our different sleep times. I go to bed early and get up early for my Boeing job. It is working out pretty well. I also had a week-long work trip to Ohio this month. We are hoping this fix is the ticket for getting her back on the Spyder and active in going on rides and other activities this coming year.

December 12th marked a date 11 years ago when I lost my 1990 Honda Pacific Coast. It was my second street legal motorcycle that I purchased in 2008. Kind of a baby Gold Wing at 800cc and lots of plastic. I loved the look of them and figured it would be a good step up to get my riding skills ready for a real Gold Wing. It was a fun and easy to ride bike. Over the 4 years I had it, I put on around 36,000 miles. That day 11 years ago, I was riding to work in Everett at 4:00am in pouring rain. Lots of standing water on 405, and at 70 mph changing lanes, one of the wheel track rut puddles was too much for my rear wheel to keep traction. I went down hard on the right side. The picture at the bottom of the article shows the condition of the bike as it lay at the towing yard. It was hit by two trucks that did not see it laying in the middle of 405. Not much plastic left on it. I was not hurt but not bad, could have been worse if there were cars following me. I had several thick layers on and slid on the wet road. What did I learn with all of this? When riding in the rain, keep your speed down, pick a lane and stay in it, avoid standing water, ride center track when possible. Wear all your gear all the time. Cover the skin you want to keep. You never know when or what will cause you to go down. Be prepared for it. The Christmas party was fun, lots of good food, fun gifts and good fellowship with our members. Now we have the new years day ride coming up if the weather holds out. Also, this next year has a lot of fun things planned.



Hello fellow Wingnuts!

I wasn't at the Christmas party because I was sick. Just didn't feel well. Took Monday off after that and just ended up with a runny nose for a while. Now I'm back to somewhat normal.

I know an awful lot about Gold Wings. The only years that I never owned were the 1980-1983 GL1100's.

I've owned 1978 GI1000 1987 GL1200 2 1500's 1993 and 1995 1 2008 GL1800 (for 3 whole weeks) 2012, 2014, and 2015 1 2019 DCT Tour And also numerous bikes in between.

Here's my point, so knowing a lot about the Gold Wings I still don't know everything that there is to know about them. That's why I have manuals for most of them and belong to a chapter with good friends that probably know more than me. Thanks to Mike Breise for the use of his expertise and his garage.

With everyone that I work with on the bikes, sometimes it's nice to just stand back and watch how someone else does a particular job. Sometimes I'm relying on someone's expertise and then just watching how they do a particular job. That's how I learn. Not because I don't know how to do something but maybe there is a better way that I just never thought of. Same results, different journey.

Here are some tips that I've learned by watching and not doing.

JIS (Japanese Industrial Screwdrivers) have been around for years and until 4 or 5 years ago, I never heard of them. They are a Phillip's head but with a different point. Case in point, the little screws that are on all Gold Wing at the accessory terminals. Positive and negative. The screws are difficult to loosen. If you try to tighten before loosening, sometimes that's enough to get them loose. If the point on the screwdriver tries to cam out or not stay in the screw, you will probably strip out the head. That's where the JIS screwdrivers come in handy. All of the Gold Wings are JIS. Most won't be stripped out using a Phillip's head but those on the accessory terminal will, very easily.

When taking off the screws on each side of the fairing, mark them with a fine point marker. Top to bottom, 1.2.3.4. Helps to get them where they should go back in.

If you are tearing down for an air filter or something like that, take some pictures as you go and get someone to help you as you work on it. Doesn't take as long and if there is something that's missed, better to have two sets of eyes. Much more fun also!

Check your tires! Enough said.

- * Kickstand




