Sportier and Fun

When the new Gold Wing came out in 2018, there were endless critics decrying the changes. It's so much smaller, not as much storage/luggage capacity, sporty looking and many more things. These were all positives in my view. I liked the sportier look and feel, I don't make long trips and don't need the large storage, I really liked the DCT option and could envision stop and go traffic without constant clutching. My short test rides on the new DCT did not do anything to convince me otherwise. I really liked the ease and fun feeling it had. I had to wait 5 years to finally own one and with the changes made over the years, I gained with the larger trunk, better passenger hand grips and several other improvements. Now I am approaching 6000 miles on it and have a good feel for the things I really like and some things I don't like about it. It might help you in the future if you are considering upgrading to the new DCT Gold Wing. It is extremely fun to ride. I have only used sport mode a few short times and I call it "Ridiculousness Mode". It is ridiculous and not usable on a regular style ride. Tour Mode is perfectly fine for everyday riding.

I found out that the paint used by Honda in Japan is now a water-based paint. It is extremely soft and scratches really easy. Not good on a gloss black bike. The seat material is also really susceptible to scuffing marks that do not come out easily. When getting on and off the bike, you cannot drag your boot on the seat. Now to the DCT. I wear earplugs while riding so I don't hear the clunking sounds from shifting but I feel them. Accelerating is easy, twist and hold the throttle on, no need to back off a little between gears. Slowing down I have found is something I am not really happy with. Even when riding on roads with a 45-mph speed limit, the bike shifts to 7th gear. When you let off of the throttle, the bike wants to immediately start downshifting and engine braking. It is jerky and slows too fast in some cases. Now you have 6 gears to go through down to 1 as it clunks and jerks at each one. You have to find the sweet spot between power on and power off if you need to speed up a little. The throttle is by wire, not two cables in a push-pull configuration. There is a slop spot with nothing. It is really touchy and takes a steady hand to keep it from jerking when going back to power on. This is when I miss the ability of a clutch to use feathering to smooth it out. When going over bumps during power off times, just the bump

can cause your hand to apply power when you don't want it causing a jerking forward. It is not a deal breaker with all this, it does take time to get used to it. The list of advantages is long and I have mentioned them I previous articles. I am still very happy I chose this bike. Not sure I would get the gloss black if I had to do it again. I think the 2024 White with black and red accents looks pretty sweet.

Another subject, I see a lot of videos of bike crashes. Taken from other vehicles with dash cams or from dash cams on the bikes involved. Most of these do not look good for the rider. Many are cars turning left in front of the bike, either going in the same direction or oncoming. Sad that the car did not see the bike but also a problem that the bikes appear to be going way to fast for the conditions or traffic flow. I worry about this all the time but can honestly say I have not had this happen, even a close call. I tend to be defensive as I ride and keep ample distance and keep my speed down in high traffic conditions. Riding a bike is dangerous, doing it safely is possible and it is up to us to keep our eyes peeled for situations that could cause us trouble. With the colder weather, dress warm, heated gear if you have it, don't ride if the roads could be icy. Take care and we'll see you at the meeting and Christmas party.

Aftermarket Heated Handgrip wraps for my GL1500.

Last month I mentioned that I was missing the comfort of the heated handgrips that are on my 2017 GL1800 when I ride my GL1500. I sought out an alternative that did not include OEM handgrip removal.

I found several offerings and ordered three to examine and evaluate. They were all reasonably priced at or below \$25. The first of them arrived on Friday so on the following Sunday I installed them. This set cost \$21.65 after sales tax.



Naturally, it had to be customized to make it fit on the GL1500. The wires were too short between the heat pads to span the handlebars and the power cord would never reach any available power connection. No problem as those kind of modifications are in my wheelhouse.

The three heat settings are all comfortable while in use. The grips warm very well through my Olympia Wind-Tex winter gloves. The 40° , 50° 60° C settings are optimistic at best. I think they reached 110° (43° C) at most.

The second set of grip heaters arrived a day after I installed the fabric heaters with shrink tubing covers. This set didn't need surgery to the wiring to make it all fit. There was more than ample wire length between the heating pads to mount them to the hand grips and reach power.



There are both pros and cons for this style of grip heater. At a price o \$19.77 that would be the first Pro. Second is ease of installation; they wrap around the grip and are held in place with integral Velcro hooks and loops. Third is wiring; no wire modifications were necessary.

As you can see, there is a USB connector on the end of the wire that plugs into a 5 volt supply. That could be a Pro or a Con, depending on how you feel about USB power supplies. In my case it was not a problem, I have some 12 volt to 5 volt/3 Amp adapters from previous projects. You could also use a power socket 12 volt to 5 volt adapter as seen in the far right picture.

The biggest Con to these heated grip wraps, unlike the previous set of grip heaters, there is no temperature control and no way to turn them on or off. They have fair heat but on a normal day here in the Northwest, you may eventually need to turn them off. They did at least reach 100°f.

I have sort of solved the on/off problem by having the USB connection terminate just under the fuel cap access door of my GL1500. I can stop, open the access door, and unplug the grip heaters if necessary. Not exactly convenient. One more possible con, the wrap makes the grips thicker and could cause your clutch lever to not go full travel to the grip. That would prevent the second micro switch from engaging in the clutch lever. That would prevent the bike from starting while it is in gear with the clutch lever pulled in. I also did not care for the lack of an on/off or temperature control.

The third of three sets of hand grip warmers arrived. I installed and tested them.



The installation on the OEM grips was simple. The very flexible wire with integral connectors made this look to be the perfect set of add on grip heaters. I had to do some modification to the controller wires to make them long enough for the installation but that was pretty much expected.

As much as I liked the appearance and ease of installation, they did not come up to expectation for heating. Though the seller touted a 104°f to 158°f capability, they never achieved more than 90°f.

Bottom line, the USB powered grip wraps that I bought and tested were inadequate. Though I used a 12 volt to 5 volt 3 Amp converter, there was not enough power to warm the grips properly.

I settled on the first set of wrap around heaters that had 12 volt input. And, at \$21.65 after tax, they are a pretty good buy.



In April 1996 Michael was assigned by Boeing to the Cleveland NASA windtunnel for a project. We were told it would be 6 months to 2 years so we naturally we took our 1989 1500 Berrywine Goldwing with us. We discovered that the local GWRRA chapter met at the restaurant a block from us. So we joined GWRRA and had some fun. During our 10 month stay there, Michael bought a matching trailer. In April 1997 we loaded our bike and trailer nd headed back to Seattle. Boeing was only providing 7 nights in a hotel so we tent camped and stayed at relatives for all the other nights. We rode 5500 miles in 28 days. There was snow in almost every state we passed thru so we had to avoid all the mountain passes. We ended up turning north from El Paso TX and rode home via CA 101 just north of Los Angeles. We visited the Carlsbad Caverns, Grand Canyon, Canyon de Chelly, Hoover Dam and stayed at the MGM Las Vegas. We also stopped at the Hearst Castle and drove our bike through one of the famous California redwood trees. In Oregon and Washington, we rode on 15 in pouring rain....Couldn't wait to be home again.

The only true adventure was a late Friday afternoon passing thru Death Valley. As we neared our exit to Ridgecrest CA going uphill, the back tire went flat. We got out our heavy battery cell phone and our GoldBook and made a call. We got lucky. He came with a trailer for the bike and his wife came with a SUV to tow the trailer. The Ridgecrest Tire store was already closed but they lived a few blocks from our hotel. So early Saturday before their chapter ride, they dropped us, the bike and trailer and all our belongings at the tire store. Lucky us again, the tire store opened shortly thereafter and we were on the road again in about 2 hours. We still keep a current GoldBook in our bike.




