Goldwing Preventative Maintenance

What a month. Lots of riding and good times. It's fun to see everyone

I don't know how to check the valves on this 2019. They are supposed to be checked at 24,000 miles but life gets in the way. So at 32,000 I finally get it into Southbound. They had it for a week and checked the valves, changed the brake fluid and installed new front brake pads.

The fluid was old as this was the first time it had been changed. The pads had about 16,000 miles on them and the valves did not need anything.

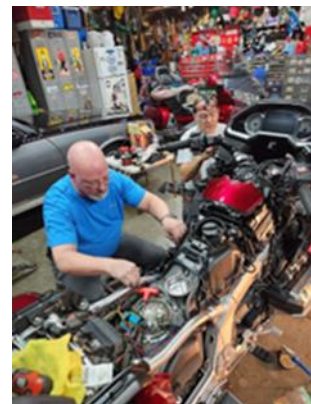
Front brake pads have a short life on this bike. About 16,000 miles.

The stock Bridgestones had about 16,000 also. I went with Dunlop E4's and they really have very little wear on them for having 16,000 miles. I'm planning on taking a 3 week trip to the midwest in July so I will get them changed even though they would probably make it all the way back. I'm just not going to take that chance.

The rear brake pads were changed at about 17,000 miles and not that they really needed to be changed. I see very little wear if any on them.

Since it's the DCT model, there is a parking brake on the rear disk as well as the rear braking system. That is super easy to adjust and has had to be just a couple of times. I very rarely use it.

So, 33,000 miles on the bike now and it really needs nothing but a new seat. The stitching is coming apart under my butt. Everyone complains about this seat. It's not very comfortable for more than a couple of hours. But for now, I guess it will do.

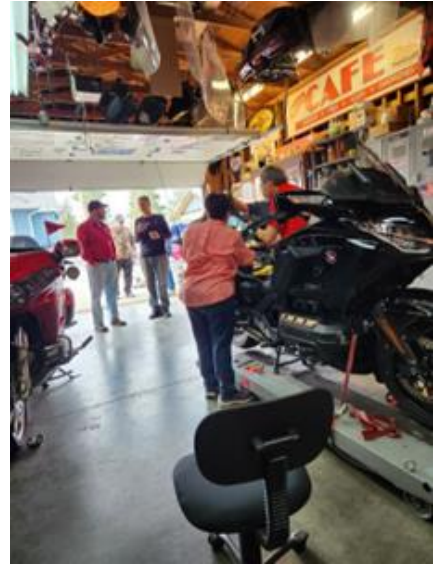
All kinds of preventative maintenance was completed....

The Ice Cream stop was at “Brenda’s” on the way to Morton



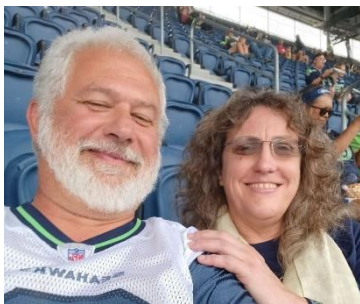
All fifteen of us standing in the shade at the Elma reststop.....

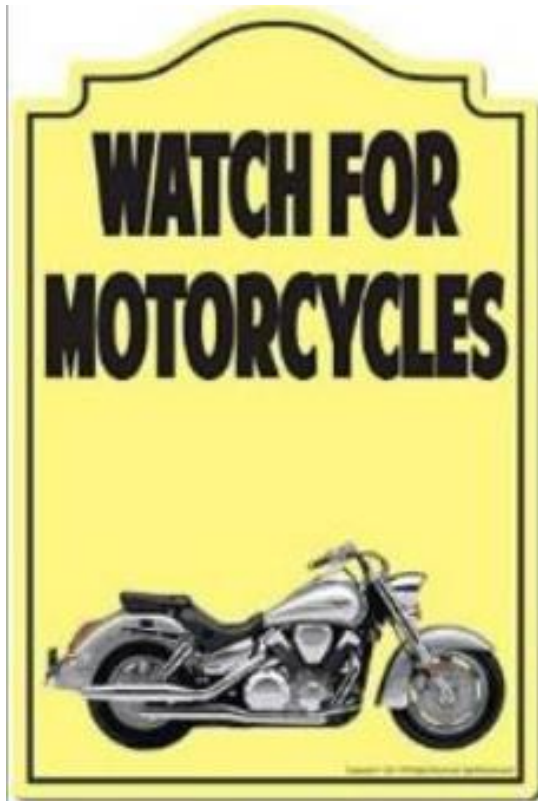
