It's February. On March 23rd, Chapter A will be holding our annual Maintenance Day in Bill Crain's Man Cave. Thank you Bill and Linda.

Bill Crain is hosting our Maintenance Day in his Man Cave this year on March 23rd. At this point I'd like to recognize and thank Don and Tina who have sponsored our maintenance day activities since 2002. Don's facilities and Don and Tina's hospitality are always top notch. Unfortunately this year, they have other priorities that will prevent them from hosting this crowd of rowdy motorcyclists. Thank you so much Don and Tina.



If you will be coming to our Maintenance Day at Bill's Man Cave in Puyallup, please Contact Harry by phone or email for more information. I'm pretty sure we will be having a lunch of burgers and dogs at the Man Cave. If you would like to bring a side dish (salad or chips or dip or sodas or water or a dessert) please contact Claudia and ask her what we will be needing to fill out the menu.

Keep in mind that some maintenance tasks may be a bit too time consuming for a Maintenance Day activity while in someone else's garage, especially if you have never done the task before or have only done it once. Just this week I rebuilt the fork tubes for Mike and Jocelyn P's GL1500. Mike removed the fork tubes and delivered them to me in my garage, along with the fork oil, seals and bushings. I took my time and It took me about three and a half hours to disassemble, clean and rebuild them and then clean up. And that was with the fork tubes off the bike and did not include re-installation. Removal and re-installation can easily take upwards of three hours. That doesn't mean it can't be done during Maintenance Day. You just have to have a good idea what you are doing, have all the parts needed and don't let time bite you in the behind.

If you plan to replace or install new parts, make sure you order those parts a couple of weeks in advance of March 23rd. Do you need your brake pads replaced? Make sure you bring your pads and some Brake Cleaner with you to flush the caliper pistons. The Super Tech (Walmart Brand) Brake Cleaner sells for about \$3.50 a can. Some Blue Shop Paper Towels would be helpful as well. Costco sells the blue shop paper towels in 10 roll packages at a pretty good price. Usually les than \$3 a roll.

Do you need new brake rotors? Bring your rotors and new mounting bolts if you think they are needed. Honda recommends replacing the rotor bolts when the rotors are reinstalled.

Do you need to bleed your brakes and clutch? Bring at least two pints of Dot 4 brake fluid of your choice.

Do you need to replace your coolant? Bring a gallon of coolant and a gallon or two of distilled water to flush your radiators.

Are you due for an oil and filter change? How about an Air Filter? Make sure you have oil, a filter and drain bolt sealing washer. Bring along your Honda Service Manual. It has some really valuable information that any maintainer would need to do required maintenance.

Remember, if you have maintenance you want to do or need help with, please give advance notice to Harry. It will give us the opportunity to make sure we have the appropriate tools and/or supplies available.

Do you have a desire to replace your OEM Halogen headlight bulbs with LED bulbs? Make sure you have them with you. On the fifth generation Gold Wing ($2001 \sim 2017$), it may be necessary to remove the fairing shelter to install the high beam bulbs. The low beams can usually be replaced without removing the shelter.

Do you want to install driving lights or accessory LED light strips? Bring them along, one of us can most likely help you with most anything you need to do. We will just need advance notice so we can be sure the tools and supplies are on hand to help you with the install.

One other thing to consider, if you have heated clothing that is not heating or that you know needs to be electrically repaired, bring it along. Pants and jacket liners connections are usually simple to repair. Glove internals are another issue all together. If the issue is not with the power supplied by the bike, the clothing itself can usually be repaired. It can sometimes be as easy as a broken wire that can be replaced or soldered or a connector that is not making good contact. Connectors can be replaced.

Bill has a platform lift so wheel assembly removal should be easy enough. He doesn't have a tire machine so tire replacement will not be possible here. We will also have at least one other motorcycle jack available (if not more) to jack up your fourth or fifth generation Gold Wing (1988 ~ 2017).

Keep in mind that anything you bring to the facility must be taken with you when you leave. Bill does not have oil, antifreeze, brake fluid or cleaning solvent recycle facilities. Make sure you have sufficient containers to haul away any waste solvents or oils you may need to dispose of. I don't think Bill would have a problem with disposing of soiled paper towels or other paper products.

Here is a short list of supplies that may be needed; Shop Towels, Aerosol Brake Cleaner, Nitrile Gloves, Hand Cleaner like Goop or Fast Orange, Low voltage wire for electrical installations, Assorted electrical Terminal Ends, Assorted Fuses, Blue Loc-Tite thread locker, Wheel Bearing Grease for wheel axles and or bearings, Silicone Brake Grease for brake pad slide pins. Last but not least, the Honda Service Manual and any Special tools you may need.



Goldwing Preventative Maintenance



Greeting to all of you!

There is a Safety recall on the 2018-2024 Goldwing Gl1800/B/BD/D/DA To inspect and or replace... the fuel pump assembly.

I haven't gotten my Goldwing front wheel vibration figured out. I took it to Mike Breise, And we tried several things trying to get it to stop. Changing wheel and tire combinations. Nothing seemed to work. I think at this time I am going to buy a new front tire and hopefully that will make everything better.

Since we had the wheels off, it was a great time to check the brake pads. The fronts were shot but the back was ok. Since everything was apart, we changed them. They were bought from South Bound Honda for only \$195.00. All three sets. A lot of money for brake pads. But they are Honda brand.....

I have, in both the wheels on the Goldwing and Valkyrie, balancing beads. They seem to work well and are very easy to install but just a little time consuming.

While trying to take out the valve stem on one of the wheels, a lot of force was required to get it out. I eventually ended up getting some pliers and helping the tool turn. It was a bugger but, I finally succeeded.

I found an article about valve stems and read that they are only designed to have about 4 pounds of pressure to tighten. Mine were well passed that. After reading that, I found a tool on Amazon that will only torque a valve stem to 4lbs.

They list for about \$20.00. I think one will find it's way to my tool box.....


The motorcyclist pulls up beside the little girl again and says,
