I'm really sorry I was unable to ride on the Five Aces ride this month. I had made previous plans to visit family in southern California. I hope you guys enjoyed lots of ice cream on the 31st.

Wednesday May 28th was a beautiful day. We celebrated our 50th wedding anniversary that day to clear skies and lots of sunshine. Thursday was supposed to be just as nice weather wise but much to my chagrin, it was raining as I opened the garage door to leave home at 6:00 am. It didn't stop raining on me until somewhere around Salem about four hours later. Yep, four hours. Thursday morning rush hour traffic combined with rain really slowed me down.

I knew the traffic would not be great on a Thursday morning through Portland but I was sure it would be better than on Friday. I guess I was wrong. By the same token, I knew I 5 through Portland would be slow no matter what day it was so I opted for I 205. I had no sooner gotten on the on-ramp to I 205 when I could see all the traffic backing up. Crap. And the rain is still falling and coating my windshield. The rain was light at times but that seemed to exascerbate matters. A light rain is not usually a problem, unless you are riding at lower speeds. My windshield was not shedding the rain. It normally will shed quite well but I have to be travelling in excess of 40 mph. Today on I 205, it was 20 mph at best most of the way, all 25 miles of it.

I was kind of kicking myself for not taking I 5. But then I heard on a local FM Radio station that there was a blocking accident on the southbound side of I 5. There was a back up of about five miles. I guess I got lucky after all but I didn't feel so lucky stuck in the I 205 backup.

By the time I'd gotten 300 miles down the road for the day, to Oakridge I was feeling a lot better. The scenery was great and it was dry. The next 400 miles or so was more or less uneventful. Once again I was reminded that traveling at 10 mph over the speed limit is still just too slow for most drivers. I firmly believe that if the speed limit was set at 100 mph, everyone would be going 120 mph.

I had thought of taking US 395 between Oregon and California but it was a bit out of the way for me so I opted for CA 139 between Klamath Falls and Susanville. Had I taken US 395, I would not have encountered this surprise. About 50 miles ahead of Susanville there was an automated traveler alert sign telling travelers to tune to 1610 AM for important information. An audio broadcast was telling travelers that the road into Susanville was closed two miles north of the city between the hours of 8:00 am and 4:00 pm, Monday through Friday. This was due to highway revitalization.

My watch was telling me it was 4:35 pm but I was still concerned. At the time I had no idea if there was a way around Susanville from where I was. Plus, I had planned to get gas in Susanville. By the time I would get to the road closure area, the closest gas station would be close to 70 miles behind me and I would not have enough gas to get back. I already had 120 miles on this tank of fuel. Susanville was 50 miles ahead. I pressed on. I kept seeing cars coming from the south, off and on, and there were a few cars that had passed me in a rush headed south so I figured I would be in good shape. It turned out that the construction had finished for the day and the one lane road had an automated traffic light system to allow vehicles to pass.

I breathed a sigh of relief and pressed into Susanville for gas. The next 113 miles into Reno was uneventful.

The La Quinta motel I stayed at in Reno was newly refurbished and in really good condition and only \$87.00 a night. The air conditioner worked very well. The bathroom was very clean and nicely laid out with new fixtures. The only down side, or so I thought, was that the sink was very slow to drain.

Friday's ride was only going to be about 475 miles so I got up a little earlier than I needed. I was looking forward to their advertised complimentary breakfast. I rounded the corner into the breakfast area only to be greeted by the second down side of the motel. A sign that said, TEMPORARILY CLOSED DUE TO RENOVATION. Crap.

Well, I had planned to go to Costco for fuel in Carson City 34 miles away anyway. So now, fueling the body was on the agenda as well. There was a Denny's just 30 miles down the road on my way to Carson City. A 55+ senior omlette with plenty of coffee fueled the body quite well. A quick pit stop after paying the bill and out to the bike I went.

The \$3.95 to \$4.59 gas prices in Washington, Oregon and Nevada are high like everywhere else but they couldn't compare to California. In Lee Vining CA I saw prices of \$5.99 to \$6.14. I've done this trip often enough over the years to know to get gas somewhere other than Lee Vining.

Onword south passing Mammoth Lakes and into Bishop. It was a warm ride. Temperatures around 100° to 104° was the norm rather than the exception. The cool collar came out of the ice chest in Pearsonville north of Inyokern. That sure felt good.

The road into and through Victorville has really been improved. US 395 used to be in pretty bad shape in this area. The closer to Adelanto you got, the worse the road was. Not anymore. Unfortunately I 15 between Victorville and Rancho Cucomonga was pretty much a 20 mile long parking lot.

It was Friday afternoon and the get off work and get into town traffic had begun. The next stretch of hot concrete and asphalt was going to be less than enjoyable. Luckily for me, and other motorcyclists, lane splitting is allowed and widely accepted in California. I'm a little rusty at lane splitting but I managed to ride the white lines and make it work. Because of that, I spent very little time on the freeway with my feet on the ground.

The stay in Riverside county was pretty productive. I set up a new computer for my sister. Her old Windows 10 computer was giving her problems. Since Microsoft support for Window 10 computers is coming to an end anyway, I bought her a new one. Set up was time consuming since I had to import her data into the new PC. The Windows 11 platform is a little bit different than the old system so there is a learning curve. Luckily I had several days to teach her how to use it, which was a challenge. She has limited computer skills. By Friday I was ready to get out of town, but the threat of So Cal traffic kept me from leaving until Sunday morning.

Sunday morning, I was on the road at 5:45 am. Perfect time to get out of the southern California area. Traffic was light to non-existent for the most part. My initial plan was to ride north over I 5 through Bakersfield and into Yreka for the night. I had not done that route for several years and I wanted to see if Shasta Lake had come back up. In years past it had pretty much turned into a mud puddle in comparison to what it was when I was a teenager.

There was one glitch though. As of Wednesday morning, fires had erupted along the Grape Vine north of Castaic. I needed to avoid that area. I don't like the Grape Vine drive at all anyway. Drivers can be real idiots on that stretch of road, in both directions. So, I 15 to US 395 and into Bakersfield and west to I 5 I went. Except for the 110° temperatures through Redding and Shasta Lake it was a pretty good day all the way to Yreka.

Putting up with the heat was worth it for the reward of seeing Shasta Lake back up to within a few feet of totally full. To top it all off, I could see that Mount Shasta still had snow on it. Awesome.

After a comfortable night's stay in Yreka at an Econo Lodge, the first destination was Portland. I was to meet up with a guy to inspect a new set of Dunlop Elite 4 tires, a $2006 \sim 2010$ GL1800 Heated seat and an un-vented Tulsa windshield that he had advertised on the GL1800 Rider's forum. He was liquidating his father's stash of parts that were no longer needed. I am not in need of these parts but I have this penchant for taking advantage of a good deal when I see it. I just know that the tires will come in handy soon for me, or someone I know, and the seat and windshield are premium parts. The seat alone sells for between \$1800 and \$2300 depending on where you look. And the Tulsa windshield is no longer manufactured. The meet up and inspection went off without a hitch.

Getting to Portland around lunchtime worked out well. Traffic was not too heavy, but I know that getting through Olympia and into Tacoma was going to be problematic. I really didn't want to go through the late afternoon gauntlet of go home traffic. So, the plan was to exit I 5 at exit 88 and head for Tenino, Yelm and Spanaway over SR 12, SR 507 and SR 7. This turned out to be the best route possible for that time of day. Of course, I skirted around Yelm via the Lake Lawrence turnoff of SR 507 in Rainier. Yelm is always stop and go in both directions this time of day. I 5 had several accidents and delays were multiple in the JBLM area this afternoon. I was home in time for dinner.

The length of the trip was 2290 miles. I used about 63 gallons of fuel at a cost of about \$265. I averaged a little over 36 mpg and had tons of fun and made points with the siblings. Traveling alone is not for everyone, but it is a lot less complicated. A couple of years ago, Bill and I made a modified version of this trip. I dropped him off in Taft to visit his family while I went to Riverside County to visit mine. I Wish he had been available to do it again.

If you know of anyone that needs a heated seat for a 2006 through 2010, new Dunlop Elite 4 tires, or a Tulsa windshield with no vent, let them know that you know a guy. The front tire is 130/70R-18, the rear tire is 180/70R-16 – Taller profile than stock (180/60R-16 is the standard profile). The 70 series rear tire corrects the speedometer error in the earlier Generation five Gold Wings.

It has been an extremely busy couple of months. Other than going back and forth to work, I haven't been doing any riding. Lots of things to do before I get my left knee replaced. Not sure when that is going to happen but should be in the next six weeks or so.

So, I was trying to get the Wing up onto the center stand and not having any luck. Obviously, I'm getting older. LOL

So, I pumped up the rear suspension and backed up the rear wheel onto a small block of wood. I made sure that the bike was steady and put down the side stand and got off. After that it was relatively easy to get it up on the center stand.

After talking to Mike Briese about PhilsFarkels center stand assist, I decided that it might be just what I need. There is a small bracket that goes onto the center stand and then a lever that goes into that bracket. Creating a longer lever to assist in getting it on the center stand. Very easy to put on and the lever, when not needed, fits into the saddlebag. Doesn't really take up any room.

Target Fixation

Rather than let it lead you into trouble, use it.

Sometimes we riders tend to minimize the risks we hear about. Take, for example, what every student of the Motorcycle Safety Foundation has heard about - 'target fixation'. 'Fixating' on something means not being able to take your attention (your eyes, for example) away from it. In the case of riding motorcycles, for example, this leads to the phenomena wherein our motorcycles tend to go in the direction we are looking and is usually described with an example familiar to all -- that if you see a pothole in the street ahead of you and don't take your eyes off it you are likely to hit it. While that is true, it is too trivial an example to get our attention appropriately. We are left with the opinion that 'target fixation' is of trivial concern because we all know that we can, if we try, avoid that pothole. In the case study we talk at great length about the tragic consequences possible from thinking that target fixation is a trivial problem. You are strongly encouraged to read that case study. While it is more graphic than most will be comfortable with, I can think of nothing that will better make the case for respecting the danger of target fixation.

It is insufficient to simply post the advice that you should avoid target fixation. Saying "don't fixate" is all very well, but once it starts, you need a positive technique to get yourself out in one piece. So, once you are in trouble, use target fixation to save your skin.

Don't look at the oncoming truck/tree/pothole; figure out where you would rather be and fixate on that instead. In fact, those of you that have taken the MSF classes know that "target fixation" is an excellent way to control skids - fixate on a point dead ahead on the horizon, and you'll be well on the way towards automatically correcting most skids.




