Destination Friendship includes Ice Cream Stops!



The riding season is not quite over yet.

The fourth weekend of September was the last weekend of Summer and it proved to be the gateway to Fall. All day Saturday and Sunday the weather was near perfect for riding the highways and byways of Washington State. Fortunately for us, we knew the roads to traverse between Auburn, Raymond, Anacortes, Maple Valley and points in between that didn't have mega construction, wild fires and smoke-filled skies all day long.

What I meant by it being the gateway to Fall is that come Sunday evening it started to rain. And rain it did for the next four days.

The after-meeting ride on the 27th was to the C&C Diner in Raymond. Mike B. led the ride consisting of Mike and Jocelyn P., Ron and Dianna H., Joe L. prospective member Jim. Total planned ride distance was to be 246 miles but we cut it short. At the last of the rest stops we decided to cut off 25 miles of secondary roads to pare an hour from the ride. It was getting late and to complete the pre-planned ride would have gotten riders home well past dark. With all of the road construction and heavy traffic on the main throughfares, it was less than a good idea to ride so late in the day.

Anacortes Oyster Run ride was on the 28th. Mike B. arrived late at the pre-planned meeting point in Kent. Traffic and mother nature are really hard to overcome. Mike and Jocelyn P. were on time and the three of us left about 15 minutes later than planned. At 7:00 am we were met by Bob Arntzen of Chapter C and prospective member Jim at the Smokey Point Rest Area. In Anacortes, Kenny U. was waiting for us. He was kind enough to reserve a table for us all at the Calico Cupboard for breakfast. Thanks Kenny. Our route to Anacortes was 126 miles.

The return trip from Anacortes was all secondary roads. The initial stop was Snow Goose Produce for ice cream. They are only 19 miles away from Anacortes. It would be sacrilege to be so close and not stop for ice cream. The next butt break was planned to be 50 miles away at a Shell station in Monroe on Hwy 2. That would leave 47 miles to the Maple Valley Dairy Queen. Comfortable ride. We encountered very light traffic and no construction on any of the secondary roads. The return route from Anacortes to Spanaway (my destination) was 151 miles. That made it a 277-mile day.

Maintenance Corner...

I took the GL1500 to run errands on Wednesday the 8th. It was a pretty nice day for ride. About an hour after I returned home, I heard an alarm sounding on my cell phone. It was the FOBO Tire Pressure Monitoring System (TPMS) alarm. I checked the message on the phone. It was a warning about the GL1500 tire pressure. I usually run 38 psi front and 41 psi rear. While riding, the tires will heat up and the pressure can increase considerably and that is what I thought was going on. Nope! The pressure in the rear tire was at 34 psi.

A quick inspection revealed that there was a small hex head screw in the rear tire. I was not ready to replace the tires yet so I decided to plug it. I carry a Stop & Go Tire Plugger on each bike. The Stop & Go Tire Plugger has worked for me the last three times I have had to use it. Well, that is when the problems started.

Problem #1: I have a lighted rear mud flap on my GL1500. It works nicely to keep road debris from being flung up onto my trailer. But it is in the way for a plugging operation. I had a heck of a time getting enough space and achieve the right angle to insert the penetrator and probe tool. There just was not enough room to get a good grip on the tool, get



into the right position for leverage, and have enough strength to insert the tool. If you have ever plugged a tire, you know that tires are tough to penetrate. So, I cheated a bit. I used a drill to put a 3/16" hole in the tire to pave the way for the penetrator and probe tool. That worked perfectly. It still took a lot of force to get the tool through the puncture, but with a little oil on the penetrator I managed to get it in.

Once the penetrator and probe tool is in, the penetrator is unscrewed from the probe tool and the plug gun is attached with a mushroom plug in the gun nozzle. The lever on the gun is used to inject the mushroom plug through the probe tool and into the tire. Then the gun with probe tool is pulled out of the tire. The tail of the mushroom is now exposed and needs to be pulled briskly to get the head flush with the inside of the tire.

Problem #2: I pulled the gun and probe tool out of the tire and the plug tail was sticking out of the tire tread like it is supposed to. With a pair of pliers, I pulled the tail of the plug to seat the head. As I pull the tail of the plug, it separates from the head. CRAP! I had mistakenly used an old plug and it failed. I thought no problem; I have a new set of plugs to use. I reinserted a new plug in the gun. I inserted the penetrator with the probe tool, I attached the gun with a new plug in it, inserted the plug and then removed the gun and probe tool. As I was laying the tool aside, the tire rotated. Now the plug was at the 6 o'clock position. As it rolled, I heard a swooshing sound. Oh-Oh!

Problem #3: That sound I heard was the [Counteract Tire Balancing Beads](#) moving in the tire. I had forgotten that I had beads in the rear tire. The front tire was statically balanced with weights on the wheel and I thought the rear wheel was also statically balanced. My mistake. Oh well, maybe it will be okay.

Problem #4: Since I use internal tire balancing beads, those tiny little beads are everywhere in the tire. They have caused me problems in the past by getting stuck in the valve stem cores. They get stuck in the core because the cores are always open due to the FOBOTMPS sensors being attached to the stems 24/7. When the beads get stuck in the core, the air leaks out when you remove the sensors to add air to the tire. If the bead doesn't blow back in when you add air, the core must be removed to extract the bead from the core. This of course lets all the air out. But I digress.

As luck would have it, when the tire rolled to 6 o'clock position, the beads had collected around the head of the plug. When I rotated the tire back to a position where I could pull the plug to seat it, the beads got between the plug and the tire. Some soapy water confirmed that the hole was still leaking air. Game over. Time to replace the tire.

Maybe I could have gone through the process of inserting a third plug but I was out of patience. Maybe if I had used a different style of tire plug repair kit this may not have happened. Luckily, I was at home and not on the road.

I had a set of tires on hand so I replaced the tires and balanced the wheels using self-adhesive weights on the wheels. My days of balance beads are over. I really don't need to relive this nightmare while on the road away from home.

One more thing, after any maintenance procedure, it is a good idea to check out the bikes systems to make sure everything is working correctly. After I had it all assembled and ready for a test ride, I did a TCLOCS inspection. In case you forgot, TCLOC stands for Tires & Wheels – Controls – Lights & Electrics – Oil & Other Fluids – Chassis – Side & Center Stand. As luck would have it, everything checked out except the brake lights controlled by the front brake handle. The foot brake lever operated the lights normally.

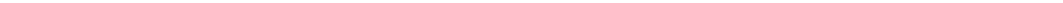
Usually, the switch that controls the brake lights can be cleaned out with some Electronic Parts Cleaner and a little air pressure. You only need to remove the switch and flush it out. This time however, it took more than a clean out. Though the micro switch for the cruise control shut off was working, the contacts for the brake lights switch was not.

I had a switch on hand. This is where having spare parts pays off. A good percentage of time, the Honda Dealer will not have the part you need in stock anyway. Besides, you can't really expect them to carry every part for every motorcycle.

The switch is held in place by one machine screw. Since I already had it out to clean it, it was a simple process to replace it with a new one. Job Done. Test ride completed. It is ready for the road.

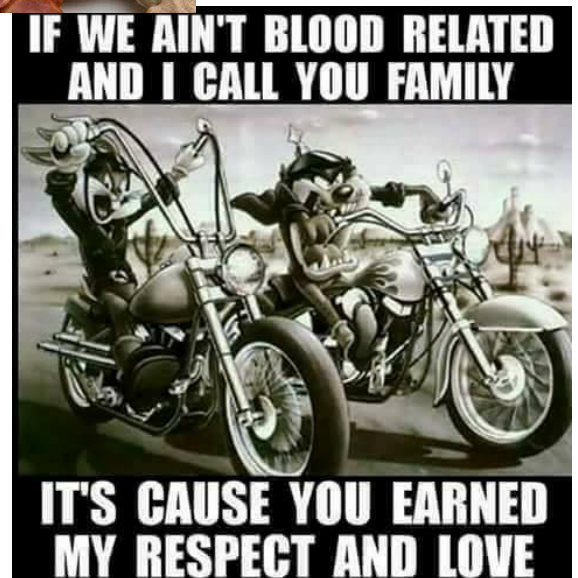

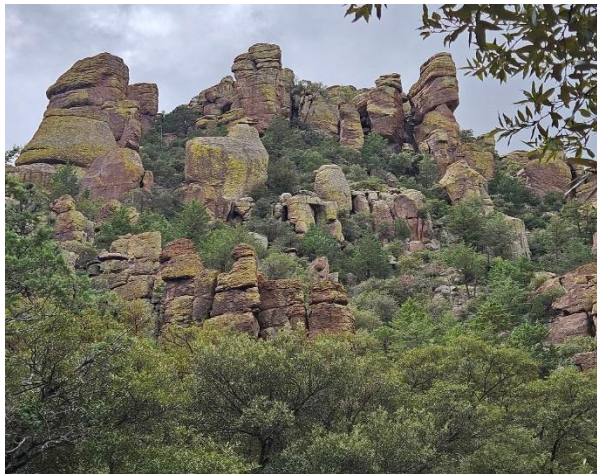

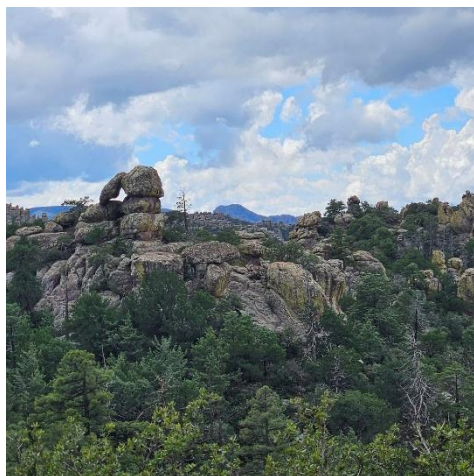
