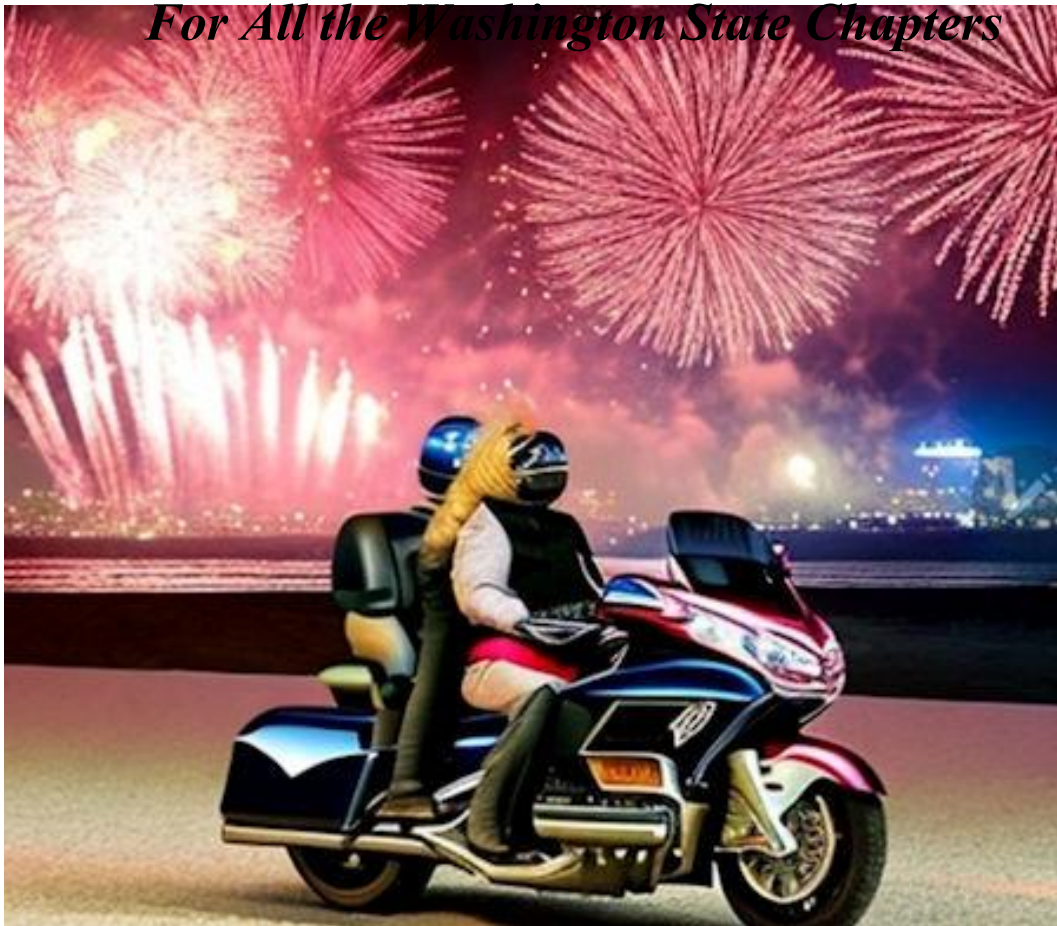

The ride to Longview was spectacular.

I absolutely hate riding I-5. That shouldn't surprise anybody.

I was thinking, how do I get to Longview without going onto I-5?

Well, I don't think that I can.

I thought, what if I take roads that I have been on, but just not sure where they go?

I went to Longview and stayed at a hotel just so I was there in the morning. Consequently, it didn't matter if I got lost.

I live in Bonney Lake and thought that I should be able to get there some way. Off I go.....

162 goes into Orting but when going west I can get onto Orville Road East that took me to Kapowsin and staying on Orville Rd E took me to Hwy 161 and into Eatonville. Then Hwy 7 to Morton. I followed the sign to I-5s and headed to Longview.

The map app said it would take 2.5 hours on I-5. I went the back way through Morton and it took about the same time.

I believe there were 13 motorcycles at Longview, giving us plenty of time to kick back and talk to each other about anything. It was a good time.

Lunch afterwards was at Porky's Public House. Good food and of course good company. Thank you, Vonda!

I had planned to be off and in Alabama and Gorgia the first two weeks of this month but I didn't see any point in spending the cash

to go. We are really trying to get some debt paid off so we can retire. So, the trip I was so planning on was cancelled. Maybe next year....

The Squaw Creek campout is in September. I had booked a room the day I got home last year. So, I'm set. Are you?

They bill you right away for one night. the rest when you leave. If you book a spot and have to cancel, you can get a refund.

As far as I know there still isn't much for cell service or internet. Back to the picnic table.....

Mike B and I did the Steven's Canyon Road last month. It goes through Mt Ranier National Park. It was awesome. Really made me wish that I was a passenger and could more closely check out the scenery. I'll have to buy a pass on Saturday.

Last week while off, I had planned on changing the rear fender on my Valkyrie. The rear fender is comprised of two separate fenders. I bent the rear part and found another on Ebay last year. I took off the saddlebags before I realized I bought the front half of the rear fender not the rear. As long as I had the saddlebags off, I replaced the brake pads. They really didn't need to be replaced but they never really worked that well anyways. I installed Honda pads. The ones on the bike didn't look anything like the Honda pads that I put on. What a difference. I never liked the braking on the rear but they had to be aftermarket cheapest he could find. (previous owner). I am a true believer in buying the best. Pads are relatively cheap compared to not stopping.

Road trips this summer and what to expect.

I just returned from a trip through Oregon, Nevada and southern California. The trip lasted ten days and it was uneventful for the most part. The Goldwing ran flawlessly as usual. As expected, the gas prices were high in California. I logged over 2,300 miles and spent almost \$300 on gas. The bike averaged 41.7 mpg.

There was quite a contrast in gas prices. The minimum I encountered was \$3.89 in Albany, OR and the maximum I saw was \$6.95 in Bridgeport, CA. I have no idea what the reason is for the price differences. For example, the gas at Costco in Carson City NV was \$3.99 a gallon. Just 80 miles away in Bridgeport, CA the Shell gas station price was \$6.95 a gallon.

The price of gas is just something we have to contend with if we want to ride, I guess. But, a bit of route planning can steer you away from the higher prices. While planning your ride, calculate the riding distances and check to be sure there are open stations where you plan to stop. Using the Gas Buddy app can steer you in the right direction for pricing. Even if you do not plan, use can still use the App to check prices.

One thing you cannot avoid, however, is the thousands of insects that are hell bent on committing suicide on your ride, or on you. During different times of the summer and different locations, there can be flies, moths, grasshoppers, June bugs and many bigger and smaller. And all of them seem to be just full of sticky innards that adhere to the bike faring and windshield like gorilla glue.

I have tried in vain over the years to apply different sprays and potions that profess to make for easy bug splatter clean up. I've tried BugSlide, TopCoat F11, Automotive Car Wax and products from Griot's Garage and none provide much in the way of positive results. You can spend lots of money just to find out that the best option is a \$1.49 eight-ounce spray bottle of Hydrogen Peroxide and Honda Spray Cleaner & Polish.

In the evenings when I stop for the night, I like to put my half-cover on the bike. The problem is, the bug guts transfer from the bike to the cover. This smears the windshield and soils the cover. The cure is to spray some Hydrogen Peroxide on the bug guts; let it set for a bit and then wipe it off with a small micro-fiber cloth. The buggy mess simply foams up as the peroxide reacts with the protein. The Hydrogen peroxide helps dissolve the proteins and organic materials found in bug guts. When applied, it foams up, which aids in loosening the residue. I recommend wearing a nitrile glove because peroxide reacts with your skin and makes it look funny but doesn't do much else.

I carry one of these bottles of Hydrogen Peroxide in the saddlebag with a couple of Microfiber cloths and some Honda Spray Cleaner & Polish. A small cloth is used to remove the bug residue, and a larger cloth is used to apply the polish. The Honda spray works great on the windshield as well as all the bikes body parts. After covering the bike, I will rinse out the small cloth and let it dry overnight. If you have never tried using Hydrogen Peroxide to remove bug guts, you really should give it a shot. I am sure you will be pleasantly surprised by the results.

12 Essential Riding Tips for New Motorcyclists

Some are attracted by fuel efficiency and the traffic slipping ability, for others, it's the pure thrill of the open road on two wheels. Either way, owning and riding a motorcycle is a fantastic experience.

But there's also serious tradeoff, your body is far more exposed to the physical forces, especially in the case of an accident! The dangers are compounded by the fact you are less visible to other road users.

For most motorcycle enthusiasts, these risks will not deter you. Instead, focus on increasing your awareness and road safety with these 12 tips for new motorcycles.

1. Always Gear Up

Even in the case of a slight spill, you'll be truly thankful you wore all your safety gear! On top of physical impact and road rash protection, it also protects you from the wind, debris and weather.

Motorcycle safety gear is health investment, consider this, how much is your head worth?

2. Ride Like a Ghost

One of the biggest causes of motorcycle accidents is not speeding or losing control of the bike, it's other road users. Due to their size, motorcycles are much harder to see and more easily hidden in blind spots.

Collisions are always far more severe for motorcyclists, so don't any chances by assuming you've been seen. So start riding as if you were invisible, this will help you anticipate problems and react quickly.

3. Cornering 101: Look Where You Want to Go

Motorcycles are highly sensitive to the rider's inputs, even looking in a direction will cause you to subtly steer towards it.

Whilst cornering, focus on the exit or as far around the corner as possible. Don't make the mistake of panicking and staring down an obstacle or verge!

4. You Have the Power – So Use it!

Motorcycles have excellent power to weight ratios and can often accelerate quicker than cars.

Use this to your advantage, quickly accelerate to speed match when joining motorways. When it comes to overtaking, a fast, efficient overtake gets you out of the danger zone quicker.

Don't be afraid to open up that throttle!

5. Keep Your Brake Covered

In certain riding situations, your reaction time needs to be doubled. For example, busy sections of town or fast twisting back roads.

At these times, get into the habit of covering the brake with a finger or two. This posed position allows for quicker reactions, it could be a lifesaver!

6. Squeeze Don't Yank

Your front brake has the most stopping power, the back brake is more suited to scrubbing speed, especially at lower speeds. Focus 75% of your slowing and stopping power on the front brake.

But quickly stabbing or yanking either brake will cause a loss of traction and control. Apply the brakes in a progressive squeezing manner, you can stop quickly without having an accident!

7. Be Cautious While Filtering

One huge benefit of riding a motorcycle is the ability to filter through traffic jams. It's perfectly legal so long as you comply with traffic signs and markings on the road. But don't let your newfound confidence overtake you, always proceed with caution. Stay in a low gear and have a finger covering the brake. Remain vigilant for signs of vehicles about to side-swipe you, especially at junctions.

8. Watch for Warning Signs

Riding safely is all about anticipating other road users. Don't rely on logic or reason, look for warning signs and then proceed with caution.

For example, if you see vehicle wheels turning and peeping out across your path, or even an indicator, always assume may pull out without seeing you.

9. Never Forget Your Lifesavers

Mirrors are great for a quick glance but don't rely on them solely. Before you make your move, always check your blind spot with an over-shoulder lifesaver.

Follow this process every time are about to change your road position or perform a maneuver:

- 1. Glance at mirror**
- 2. Quickly check your blind spot**
- 3. Perform action**

10. Always Have an Escape Route

Motorcycles are at a distinct advantage to larger vehicles when it comes to accident avoidance. They are lighter, thinner, more maneuverable and can slip through tighter gaps

Always leave a little wiggle room for quick escapes. Instead of simply hammering the brakes whilst heading straight for an obstacle, a quick swerve may be the best option.

11. Survey the Road for Hazards

Motorcyclists have more to worry about than cars. With less rubber contact with the tarmac, traction can be more easily overwhelmed causing a dangerous slide. You need to quickly identify hazards such as sand, wet patches, leaves, gravel or stones.

Also, watch out for bumps and potholes, they can destabilize the bike.

In most cases, you may be able to carefully swerve and avoid them. Otherwise, scrub off as much speed as you can safely, then keep steering/throttle/brake inputs and lean angle to a minimum as you pass over it.

12. Practice Scanning

Motorcycle safety can be greatly enhanced through situational awareness. Scanning is used to stay aware without letting your attention linger from the road ahead for too long!

Quickly take in information from your instruments, speedo, mirrors, blind spots etc. This will allow you identify and react to rising road situations faster.
